

NOTES ON EARLY CLIMBING AND MAPPING  
IN GARIBALDI PARK

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Garibaldi Peak and Park named after the Italian patriot and liberator,  
at time of coast survey of B.C., 1859.

Mt. Garibaldi  
(8737')

First recorded mountaineering interest:

A.T. Dalton and a Mr. Hoops reached the lower slopes of Mt. Garibaldi  
after a trip up Indian River in 1902.

First recorded attempt at actual climb:

Atwell D. King, A.T. Dalton, Tom Price and D. Gray got as far as the  
bergschrund on north-east face in 1904 (no details of approach).

First recorded complete ascent:

A.T. Dalton, W.T. Dalton, J.J. Trorey, T. Patterson, A.D. King,  
G.B. Warren, Aug. 8, 1907 (up Cheekye Creek, around west side on Warren  
Glacier, thence up the north-east face past the bergschrund. (7 hours up,  
4 hours down, from timberline camp).

Second recorded ascent:

E. Peach and G. Walker, also in 1907.

Third recorded ascent:

A.T. Dalton, T. Price, F.L. Townley, G.B. Warren, 1908, via southern  
route facing the Dalton's Dome and up snow face between main peak and  
the Pinnacle.

First recorded ascent by ladies:

Misses L.C. Hanafin and C.P. Munday, July, 1913.

Mt. Mamquam  
(8400')

First recorded ascent:

W. Gray, F. Perry, W. Taylor, F.H. Smith, F. Korten, C. Chapman, 1911,  
prior to a summer camp of the B.C.M.C. on Round Mt.

First recorded ascent by ladies:

Misses L.C. Hanafin and C.P. Munday, 1913.

Garibaldi  
Lake Area

First recorded mountaineering approach:

Party of ten from 1911 B.C.M.C. summer camp on Round Mt. went overland,  
camped on ridge near Guard (Sentinel) Pk., thence next day across Sphinx  
Glacier and made first recorded ascent of Copper Peak. Resolved to hold  
1912 camp in the Garibaldi Lake Area seen during this trip.

Black Tusk  
Meadows

First approach for mountaineering:

In 1911, W. Gray explored a route to the meadows via Rubble Creek and the  
Barrier, and scouted the area around the meadows and lake for a B.C.M.C.  
campsite for the following summer.
